

LKSD Revised Safe Return to Learn/COVID-19 Guidelines
Effective 09/23/22

LKSD utilizes the CDC COVID-19 Community Levels guidance for determining a base risk level/operational status of each school in the district. LKSD will ensure that each school is also following local ordinances, should they include more stringent mitigation strategies than the District’s. When an individual community is identified by YKHC as having widespread community transmission, the local school(s) will be moved to the high-risk operational status until widespread community transmission of COVID-19 is resolved in that community. Widespread community transmission determinations made by YKHC factor in a case count metric in addition to the total number of positive households within a given community.

How CDC Measures COVID-19 Community Levels

The CDC looks at the combination of three metrics — new COVID-19 admissions per 100,000 population in the past 7 days, the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients, and total new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population in the past 7 days — to determine the COVID-19 community level. New COVID-19 admissions and the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied represent the current potential for strain on the health system. Data on new cases acts as an early warning indicator of potential increases in health system strain in the event of a COVID-19 surge.

Using these data, the COVID-19 community level is classified as low, medium, or high.

Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. Spectators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No limit on gym capacity, vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals allowed, follow mitigation strategies for risk level
Out of region travel for student athletes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Out of region travel for vaccinated and unvaccinated student athletes allowed, unless there is a community quarantine requirement in place for travelers upon return
Coaches/chaperones	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No vaccination requirement • Out of region travel for vaccinated and unvaccinated coaches/chaperones allowed, unless there is a community quarantine requirement in place for travelers upon return

Return travel from out of region for students or staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Return to school or work and monitor for symptoms• Follow local mandates if stricter than LKSD's travel guidance
COVID-positive students/staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Isolate for 5 days• If you had <u>no symptoms</u>, you may end isolation after day 5, but wear a well-fitting mask through day 10• If you had <u>symptoms</u>:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ You may end isolation after day 5 if:<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ You are fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication▪ Your symptoms are improving▪ When you end isolation, wear a well-fitting mask through day 10○ If you still have fever or your symptoms have not improved, continue to isolate up to 10 days• Follow local mandates if stricter than LKSD's guidance
Close contacts – students or staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Wear a mask as soon as you find out you were exposed to COVID-19 and continue precautions for 10 full days• Watch for symptoms• If you develop symptoms isolate immediately, get tested, and stay home until you know the result• If you test positive, follow the guidance for COVID-positive students/staff
